Nebraska Ag Facts

- 1 in 4 jobs in Nebraska are related to agriculture.
- Nebraska had 44,400 farms and ranches during 2023; the average operation consisted of 991 acres.
- The total value of agricultural products sold in 2022 was \$31.6 billion. Of that total value of production, 52% originated from livestock with 48% from crops.
- Nebraska's 10 leading commodities (in order of value) for 2022 cash receipts are cattle and calves, corn, soybeans, hogs, dairy products (milk), chicken eggs, hay, misc. crops, wheat, and potatoes.
- In 2021, every dollar in agricultural exports generated \$1.07 in economic activities such as transportation, financing, warehousing and production.
- Nebraska's \$9.98 billion in agricultural exports in 2022 translates into \$10.68 billion in additional economic activity.
- Nebraska's top five agricultural exports in 2022 were soybeans and soybean products, corn, beef, ethanol, and pork.
- In 2023, Nebraska ranked second in ethanol production capacity, with 24 operating plants having production capacity of over 2.3 billion gallons.
- Approximately 35% of Nebraska's 2023 corn crop was utilized in ethanol production.
- During 2022, the average age of producers in Nebraska was 56.9 years. The number of young producers (age 34 or less) was 9,031 or 11% of all producers. The number of female producers was 26,364 or 33% of all producers.

Nebraska's Natural Resources

- Nebraska's farms and ranches utilize 44 million acres, 89.4% of the state's total land area.
- Nebraska is fortunate to have aquifers below it. If poured over the surface of the state, the water in those aquifers would have a depth of 37.9 feet (11.6 meters).
- Nearly 80,000 miles of rivers and streams add to Nebraska's bountiful natural resources.
- There are 22 million acres of rangeland and pastureland in Nebraska, half of which are in the Sandhills.
